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Route 33 daytime shoulder closures required tomorrow as roadway improvement project begins in Hamilton Closures required for construction sign installation

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the start of a pavement rehabilitation and improvements project requiring daytime shoulder closures on Route 33 in Hamilton, Mercer County.

Beginning at 7 a.m. tomorrow, Thursday, February 25 until 5 p.m., NJDOT's Contractor, Trap Rock Industries, is scheduled to close the shoulder on Route 33 in sections as part of a moving operation between Cleveland Avenue and Paxson Avenue. These closures will allow the contractor to install construction signs. At least one lane of traffic will be maintained in both directions at all times.

Following the installation of construction signs, additional shoulder and lane closures may be required in the coming weeks to allow for tree trimming and vegetation removal. Milling and paving is expected to begin in spring 2021.

The \$6.8 million improvement project includes milling and paving, traffic signal replacement, and construction of ADA compliant curbs and ramps on approximately four miles of Route 33. The project is anticipated to be complete by Winter 2021.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
