## Route 17 northbound and southbound ramps to Route 46 eastbound to be closed this weekend in Hasbrouck Heights Closures required for curb and guiderail installation

**(Trenton)** – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that the Route 17 northbound and southbound ramps to Route 46 eastbound will be closed this weekend for pavement preservation work in Hasbrouck Heights, Bergen County.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight night, Friday, June 24, until 6 a.m., Monday, June 27, NJDOT's contractor, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc., is scheduled to close and detour the Route 17 northbound and southbound ramps to Route 46 eastbound. The closure is necessary to remove and replace the old curb and guiderail. This is a continuation of work that began last week. The following detour will be in place:

## Route 17 northbound ramp to Route 46 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on Route 17 northbound wishing to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound will be directed to turn left onto Williams Avenue
- Turn right onto Terrace Avenue
- Turn right on Longworth Avenue to take the ramp onto Route 46 eastbound

## Williams Avenue eastbound to Route 17 northbound ramp to Route 46 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on Williams Avenue eastbound wishing to take the ramp from Route 17 northbound to Route 46 eastbound will be directed to turn right onto Route 17 southbound
- Turn right onto Ottawa Avenue
- Turn right onto Terrace Avenue
- Turn right on Longworth Avenue to take the ramp onto Route 46 eastbound

## Route 17 southbound detour to Route 46 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on Route 17 southbound wishing to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound will be directed to turn right onto Williams Avenue
- Turn right onto Terrace Avenue
- Turn right onto Longworth Avenue
- Stay right on Longworth Avenue to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound

The \$8.8 million federally-funded Route 46, Bergen Boulevard to Main Street roadway improvement project will resurface approximately two miles of Route 46 in Lodi, Hasbrouck Heights, and Teterboro, Bergen County. The project also includes the installation of ADA-compliant curbs and ramps, as well as traffic signal upgrades. The project is expected to be complete in summer 2022.
