Route 46 westbound ramp to Green Street to be closed this weekend in Teterboro Closures required for curb and guiderail installation

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that the Route 46 westbound ramp to Green Street will be closed this weekend for pavement preservation work in Teterboro, Bergen County.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Friday, July 22, until 6 a.m., Monday, July 25, NJDOT's contractor, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc., is scheduled to close and detour the Route 46 westbound ramp to Green Street/Hackensack Shopping Center. The closure is necessary to remove and replace the old curb and guiderail. This is a continuation of work that began last month. The following detour will be in place:

Route 46 westbound ramp to Green Street/Hackensack Shopping Center detour:

- Motorists on Route 46 westbound wishing to take the ramp to Green Street/Hackensack Shopping Center will be directed to continue on Route 46 westbound
- Stay right to take the ramp to Route 17 northbound/Paramus
- Stay right to take the ramp to Polifly Road/I-80 eastbound/Hackensack
- Turn right to take the ramp to I-80 eastbound
- Stay right to take Exit 65 to Green Street/Teterboro/South Hackensack
- Turn right onto North Street, which intersects with Green Street

The \$8.8 million federally-funded Route 46, Bergen Boulevard to Main Street roadway improvement project will resurface approximately two miles of Route 46 in Lodi, Hasbrouck Heights, and Teterboro, Bergen County. The project also includes the installation of ADA-compliant curbs and ramps, as well as traffic signal upgrades. The project is expected to be complete in summer 2022.
