Route 17 ramps to Route 46 eastbound to be closed and detoured tonight in Hasbrouck Heights

Closures required for guiderail replacement and pavement preservation

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that the Route 17 northbound and southbound ramps to Route 46 eastbound will be closed tonight for guiderail replacement and pavement preservation in Hasbrouck Heights, Bergen County.

Beginning at 10 p.m. tonight, Tuesday, September 13, until 6 a.m. tomorrow, Wednesday, September 14, NJDOT's contractor, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc., is scheduled to close and detour the Route 17 northbound and southbound ramps to Route 46 eastbound. The closures are necessary to remove and replace the guiderail and for pavement preservation work. The following detours will be in place:

Route 17 northbound to Route 46 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on Route 17 northbound wishing to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound will be directed to continue on Route 17 northbound
- Turn left onto Williams Avenue
- Turn right onto Terrace Avenue
- Turn right onto Longworth Avenue to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound

Route 17 southbound to Route 46 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on Route 17 southbound wishing to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound will be directed to continue on Route 17 southbound
- Turn right onto Williams Avenue
- Turn right onto Terrace Avenue
- Turn right onto Longworth Avenue to take the ramp to Route 46 eastbound

The \$8.8 million federally-funded Route 46, Bergen Boulevard to Main Street roadway improvement project will resurface approximately two miles of Route 46 in Lodi, Hasbrouck Heights, and Teterboro, Bergen County. The project also includes the installation of ADA-compliant curbs and ramps, as well as traffic signal and guiderail upgrades. The project is expected to be complete in summer 2022.
