I-80 eastbound Express Exit 47A ramp to I-280 eastbound/I-80 eastbound Local to be closed tonight in Parsippany-Troy Hills I-80 eastbound Local left lane also to be closed overnight

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that the I-80 eastbound Express Exit 47A ramp to I-280 eastbound/I-80 eastbound Local will be closed and detoured tonight for concrete deck repairs in Parsippany-Troy Hills, Morris County.

Beginning at 10 p.m. tonight, Friday, December 2, until 6 a.m., Saturday, December 3, NJDOT's contractor, Mount Construction Co., Inc., is scheduled to close and detour the I-80 eastbound Express Exit 47A ramp to I-280 eastbound/I-80 eastbound Local to make concrete deck repairs. In addition, the I-80 eastbound Local left lane will be closed at Milepost 46.3. The I-80 eastbound Local Exit 47A ramp to I-280 eastbound will remain open during construction. The following detour will be in place:

I-80 eastbound express Exit 47A ramp to I-280 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on I-80 eastbound express wishing to take Exit 47A to I-280 eastbound will be directed to take Exit 45 to Lake Hiawatha/Whippany, which is before Exit 47A
- This puts motorists onto the I-80 eastbound local lanes
- Take Exit 47A to I-280/The Oranges/Newark

I-80 eastbound Express Exit 47A ramp to I-80 eastbound Local detour:

- Motorists on I-80 eastbound express wishing to take Exit 47A to I-80 eastbound local will be directed to take Exit 45 to Lake Hiawatha/Whippany, which is before 47A
- This puts motorists onto the I-80 eastbound local lanes

The work is part of a \$21.6 million state-funded maintenance project to repair concrete structures at various locations in eight counties throughout North Jersey.
