I-76 westbound lane closures tomorrow for restriping as bridge deck project advances in Gloucester City At least three lanes will be maintained

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced daytime lane closures on I-76 westbound tomorrow as a project to repair the deck on the I-76 Bridge over Klemm Avenue advances in Gloucester City, Camden County.

From 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. tomorrow, Saturday, February 11, NJDOT's contractor, South State Inc., is scheduled to close two lanes on I-76 westbound between Market Street and the Bridge over Nicholson Road to restripe the roadway. The work will start with two right lanes closed at 7 a.m., and the lane closures will move to the left as work progresses. At least three lanes will be maintained at all times on I-76 westbound.

By 7 p.m. Saturday, February 11, traffic on I-76 westbound will be shifted to the right onto the newly widened right shoulder, and construction barrier will be placed in the left lanes to create a median work zone.

The \$57.2 million project will replace the I-76 Bridge over Klemm Avenue, Conrail and the South Branch Newton Creek Bridge. In addition, the project will replace the noise walls on the bridge and on the approach roadway, as well overhead sign structures. Improvements will be made to ramps, drainage, lighting, and ITS components within the project limits. I-76 carries an average of 200,000 vehicles each day. To minimize the impact to traffic and reduce the construction time, the bridge replacement will be done in stages using Accelerated Bridge Construction (ABC) methods using prefabricated materials. The project is expected to be completed in the fall 2023.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
