Route 46 overnight lane and shoulder closures in both directions this week in Morris, Essex, and Passaic counties Closures necessary to install electrical conduit

(Trenton) – Route 46 is scheduled to have lane and shoulder closures in both directions overnight this week between I-287 in Parsippany-Troy Hills in Morris County and Route 23/Pompton Avenue in Wayne, Passaic County for the start of an intelligent transportation systems (ITS) project.

Work began last night, Monday, July 24 and will continue nightly from 8 p.m. until 6 a.m. the next day tonight, Tuesday, July 25 through Friday, July 28. A single lane and shoulder will be closed on Route 46 in both directions between I-287 in Parsippany-Troy Hills through Montville in Morris County, Fairfield, Essex County to Route 23/Pompton Avenue in Wayne, Passaic County. The closure is necessary to install electrical conduit. Construction is expected to begin in the left lane and shoulder and will move to the right as work progresses. At least one lane will be maintained in each direction overnight. Motorists are advised to slow down, use caution, and expect delays or plan an alternate route.

The \$21.5 million federally funded Route 46, I-287 to Route 23/Pompton Avenue project will improve safety and traffic flow by installing ITS devices along an approximately 10-mile stretch of Route 46 in Parsippany-Troy Hills and Montville, Morris County; Fairfield, Essex County; and Wayne, Passaic County. In addition, the project aims to enhance the safety of pedestrians and other vulnerable road users by upgrading sidewalks, ADA-compliant curb ramps, lighting, and guiderail. There are nine interchanges and eight signalized intersections within the project limits.
