## Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 to be closed for railroad crossing repairs next week in Howell Detours necessary during construction

**(Trenton)** – Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 is scheduled to be closed and detoured next week between West Farm Road and Imlay Lane in Howell, Monmouth County.

Beginning at 7 a.m. Monday, July 31, until 7 a.m. Friday, August 4, Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 will be closed in both directions between West Farm Road and Imlay Lane to remove the existing railroad crossing. The closure is necessary to reconstruct the crossing and approaches. Access will be maintained for local traffic. The following detours will be in place:

## Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 eastbound will be directed turn right onto West Farms Road
- Turn left onto Squankum-Yellowbrook Road/CR 524A
- Turn left onto Southard Avenue
- Turn left onto Main Street/CR 524
- Keep left to continue on West Main Street/CR 524, which becomes Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524

## Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 westbound detour:

- Motorists wishing to take West Main Street/CR 524 to Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524 westbound will be directed to take on Main Street/CR 524 southbound
- Turn right onto Southard Avenue
- Turn right onto Squankum-Yellowbrook Road/CR 524A
- Turn left onto West Farm Road, back to Adelphia-Farmingdale Road/CR 524

In order to provide safer and smoother railroad crossing, the existing crossing will be replaced with new concrete crossings and asphalt approaches. This federally-funded project is included within NJDOT's railroad grade-crossing safety program which repairs, upgrades, or removes approximately 50 crossings each year, statewide.
