Yale Road to be closed and detoured tomorrow and Monday in Neptune, Monmouth County Closure necessary to install drainage

(Trenton) – Yale Road is scheduled to be closed and detoured tomorrow, Friday, March 14 and Monday, March 17 between Harvard Road and Route 66 as a roadway reconstruction project advances in Neptune, Monmouth County.

From 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. tomorrow, Friday, March 14 and again on Monday, March 17 at the same time, Yale Road is scheduled to be closed from Harvard Road to Route 66. The closure is necessary to install drainage. The following detour will be in place:

Yale Road northbound Detour:

- Motorists on Route 66 wishing to access Harvard Avenue via Yale Road will be directed to Green Grove Road
- Turn right onto Princeton Avenue
- Turn right onto Harvard Avenue, back to Yale Road

Yale Road southbound Detour:

- Motorists on Harvard Avenue wishing to access Route 66 via Yale Road will be directed to Princeton Avenue
- Turn left onto Green Grove Road, back to Route 66

This work is part of the \$38.9 million federally funded Route 66, Jumping Brook Road to Bowne Road/Wayside Road Reconstruction project that will widen Route 66 from one lane in each direction to two lanes in each direction in Neptune, Monmouth County. Work also will improve sidewalks, ADA-compliant curb ramps, traffic signals and drainage. The project is expected to be completed in spring 2027.

Variable messaging signs are being utilized to provide advance notification to the motoring public of all traffic pattern changes associated with the work. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
