

- Preliminary Preferred Alternative Recommended

### 2016

- Section 106 consultation with NPS, NJSHPO, Hardwick and Knowlton Townships and Appalachian Trail Conservancy
- Timber Rattlesnake/Northern Copperhead surveys
- Phase IA Archaeological Assessment

- Project changed to an Environmental Assessment due to public concerns
